ACTION PLAN 2013

Mission: The Helen Matthes Library provides community engagement and life-long learning through literature, technology, and information access.

Vision: The Helen Matthes Library empowers individuals and enriches the community.

Values: Culture, Technology, Service

Strategic Goals

A. Provide exceptional library service

- 1. Provide education and training opportunities for staff.
 - Provide opportunities for attendance at off-site training events.
 - Provide 4 on-site training events, one of which focuses on opportunities and lessons learned from other libraries moving into a new facility.
 - Provide opportunities to visit innovative libraries.
 - Implement core technology competencies for all staff and provide training for staff to meet these core competencies.
 - Offer one Readers Advisory training event to staff/year.
 - Develop a Wellness Program for staff.
- 2. Provide a facility that meets the community's needs.
 - Continue fundraising efforts for new facility.
 - Seek out and apply for grants to help support the new facility.
 - Begin construction of new facility.
 - Keep community informed of progress of new building through a blog/local newspaper.
 - Explore alternate ordering system for adult non-fiction by analyzing which collections need to be refreshed in the next two years.
 - Develop a seed library to compliment the community gardens.
 - Explore alternatives to the Dewey classification system.
 - Explore options for front facing "easy readers" in the Children's Department.
- 3. Market our services.
 - Increase attendance at all programs by 10%.
 - Increase participation rate of Summer Read Program by 5%.
 - Increase completion rate of Summer Read Program by 5%.
 - Increase social networking presence.
 - Develop baseline service figures of women, 25-35 and men, 55-65.

- Develop business survey to see how we can better serve this population.
- Develop at least 3 community outreach partnerships to improve marketing of services and programs.
- Visit local, state, and federal representatives at least once.

B. Increase access to technology

- 1. Increase self-sufficiency of patrons through technology to allow staff to provide more specialized assistance.
 - Develop resources for readers advisory that can be used online and in person.
 - Expand efforts to have staff spend more time in stacks and at computers assisting patrons.
 - Migrate to the Polaris platform in the SHARE consortium.
 - Explore offering access to Skype for patrons.
- 2. Leverage grant dollars to continue to be good stewards of the community's resources.
 - Pursue grants that will allow the purchase of new public computers.
 - Pursue grants that will bridge our community's need for access to better technology.
 - Develop/Revise technology plan to ensure that technology is being refreshed when needed and that grant and general fund dollars are being used strategically.

C. Develop partnerships to enhance library service

- 1. Expand outreach and strategic partnership opportunities to better leverage our services.
 - Participate in EggStravaganza, Halloween Parade, Arts and Hearts, and Old Fashioned Christmas.
 - Host the Artisan Fair 5K
 - Continue to offer and develop the Homebound program.
 - Partner with at least 6 non-profit organizations to provide/enhance a program.
 - Partner with at least 6 businesses to provide/enhance a program.
 - Pursue grants that will allow for greater programming opportunities.
 - Participate in Mission: Summer Fun.
 - Increase volunteer hours by 5%.
 - Participate in the backpack program through FISH.
- 2. Become an incubator for ideas and development in the community.
 - Explore grant opportunities to purchase new equipment/furnishings to facilitate group activities.
 - Develop/strengthen relationships with the community groups and business leaders working with students and entrepreneurs.
 - Explore grant opportunities to provide books for visiting nurses while on family visits.

D. Integrate with schools

- 1. Integrate with schools to provide literacy development.
 - Develop reserve collection for local schools.
 - Promote our location as a site for tutoring and other types of community service hours for high school students.
 - Participate yearly at teacher's in-service events.
 - Have a presence at school registration events.
 - Host an unstaffed progressive storytime on the TREC trail to encourage literacy development.
- 2. Seek partnerships with higher education.
 - Continue to explore collection partnership options with Lake Land College.
 - Work with Eastern Illinois University and Lake Land College to host at least 2 community education opportunities.
 - Explore grant opportunities to host Roads Scholar events.

E. Expand our service area

- 1. Explore the variety of options of expanding our service area.
 - Increase city library card redemption by 5%.
 - Increase non-resident card participation by 5%.
 - Explore options for creating/partnering to develop Little Free Libraries in unserved areas.
 - Research different methods for expanding service area.
